

Awbridge Sports Funding 2016-17

We continue to subscribe to Personal Best Education which gives the school access to a wide variety of local and regional sports competitions as well as updating and replacing sports equipment, staff CPD and enhancing our outdoor activity equipment. Awbridge also benefits from specialist subsidised coaching both during lessons and after school.

This year to further develop Sport and PE provision at Awbridge we aim to:

- ❖ *Increase the level of participation for extra curricular sport for both KS1 and KS2 children*
- ❖ *Further develop the staff member lead for PE to Level 5*
- ❖ *Subscribe to Personal Best Education to enable access to larger group competitions over the region*
- ❖ *Provide resources for enhanced PE and sports participation*
- ❖ *Continuous professional development in PE and Sports –coaching*
- ❖ *Participate in 'Chance to Shine' cricket coaching with Hampshire Cricket Club*
- ❖ *Become a member of Hampshire FA small schools tournaments*
- ❖ *Achieve Sainsburys School Games Silver Award*

Planned spend of the grant will include

- ❖ *£2,100 participation in local and regional competitions via Personal Best Education*
- ❖ *£800 training for member of staff and general staff development*
- ❖ *£150 sports kit*
- ❖ *£4,000 for further sports equipment*
- ❖ *£400 staff release to attend tournaments and matches*
- ❖ *£350 transportation to attend tournaments and matches*

Evaluation of impact on children in school

- ❖ *Increased access to KS specific competitions throughout the year - 17 various events at KS2 and 5 at KS1(excluding football and netball competitions)this is an improvement on previous years.*
- ❖ *Every KS2 child was given the opportunity to represent the school at a competitive event and only 2 children could not do so*
- ❖ *Increased levels of sports participation at competition level both locally and regionally for football and netball. The school regularly sends two teams to these events and the recent cross country competition had more than 40 pupils from Awbridge attend*
- ❖ *Increased physical activity and healthy lifestyle as evidenced by lunchtime practice sessions and after school club commitment*
- ❖ *Opportunities to try different sports – fencing (80 pupils), cheerleading (24 pupils), basketball (20 pupils) and new age curling(80 pupils)*
- ❖ *Opportunities to participate in weekly netball, football clubs (winter), cricket and rounders clubs (summer) – 2 clubs per week average 56 pupils (37% of school cohort)*
- ❖ *Teaching children skills to be confident sports competitors*
- ❖ *Pupil leadership as ambassadors so that our Y6 pupils promote healthy lifestyles with their younger peers*
- ❖ *New resources purchased to facilitate gymnastics teaching and meant that the school was able to participate in the KS1 & 2 gym competition*
- ❖ *Staff CPD for Level 5 coaching has increased the physical participation and inclusion of PE as part of PPA*
